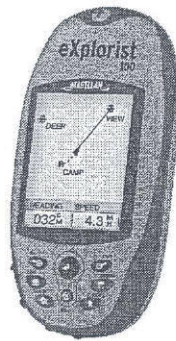
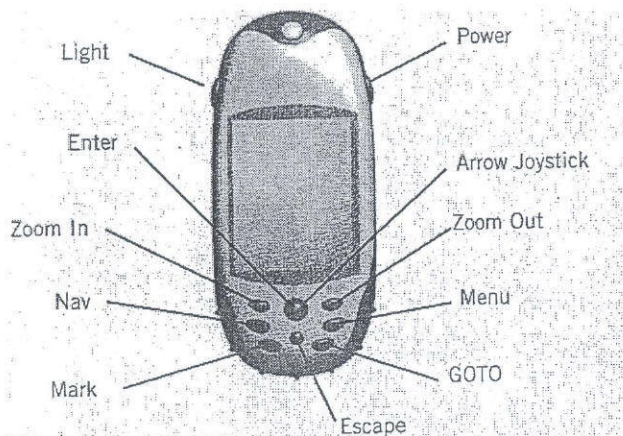

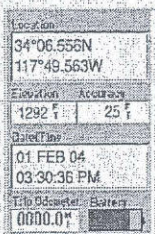

How to work the GPS to find the Geocaches:

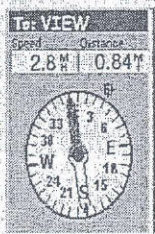


The **Position** screen displays your present position using the coordinate system selected in Preferences. Also displayed are your elevation, accuracy, date and time, trip odometer and battery life.



You can reset the trip odometer. Press Menu, highlight Reset Trip, and press Enter.

The **Compass** screen uses a graphical compass to provide you with information used to navigate to your destination. An icon outside the compass ring indicates your destination, and the compass points in the direction you are heading.



The **Compass** screen is also customizable. Press Menu, highlight Customize page, and press Enter.

1. Turn on the GPS unit by pressing the power button outside.
2. At the prompt screen, press the Enter toggle joystick.
3. Wait 2 minutes until at least 3 satellites are found.
4. After 3 satellites are found, press the GOTO button.
5. Use the Arrow Joystick to arrow to Alphabetical and press Enter.
6. Use the Arrow Joystick to arrow to the Geocache you wish to follow in order.
7. Press the Enter button (Arrow joystick) to select the Geocache.
8. Press the Nav button to switch from the Position Screen to the Compass Screen.
9. Follow the Compass to your next Geocache. *Remember: The shortest route is usually not the best route. Use trails and paths and respect campsites and unauthorized areas.*

What is a "cache?"

Pronounced "cash" [French] - In geocaching it is a hidden container filled with a log book and pencil/pen, and possibly prizes. Caches were often used by explorers, miners, etc. to hide foodstuffs and other items for emergency purposes. People still hide caches of supplies today for similar reasons.

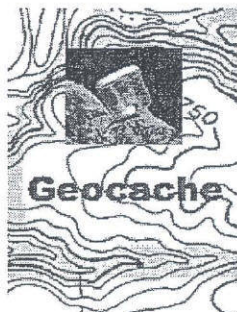

*** Please NOTE:** These Geocache coordinates are not to be published on the web or to the public. These geocache coordinates are only available to the members of the Boy Scouts of America. Geocache locations change regularly.

To respect the Allamuchy Campmaster's wishes, the coordinates are removed. See the Campmaster for the latest coordinates.

Rules:

1. Register with the Campmaster.
2. This is a patrol activity; the Patrol Leader must take charge of his patrol.
3. The Scout Oath, Law and Motto must be followed.
4. Practice 'No Trace' Hiking
5. Taking the Straight way is NOT the best way. Follow Trails/Paths – all caches are within 100 yards from a trail or road. PLEASE respect campsites and keep out of unauthorized areas.
6. Cache in, Trash Out.
7. Each patrol is to take ONE (1) item and to leave ONE (1) item. *If the patrol doesn't have anything to swap, the patrol is to sign the log only.*
8. The Patrol Leader is to let your Scoutmaster know the Patrol is participating in this program.
9. Buddy System is in effect at all times. Bring a writing implement.
